Because the Internet has changed and is changing the ways in which we think and act, it must also be changing the ways in which we think Christianity and its theology.

Cybertheology is the first book to explore this process from a Catholic point of view. Drawing on the theoretical work of authors such as Marshall McLuhan, Peter Levy, and Teilhard de Chardin, it questions how technologies redefine not only the ways in which we do things but also our being and therefore the way we perceive reality, the world, others, and God. "Does the digital revolution affect faith in any sense?" Spadaro asks. His answer is an emphatic Yes. But how, then, are we to live well in the age of the Internet? Spadaro delves deeply into various dimensions of the impact of the Net on the Church and its organization, on our understanding of revelation, grace, liturgy, the sacraments, and other classical theological themes. He rightly points out that the digital environment is not merely an external instrument that facilitates human communication or a purely virtual world, but part of the daily experience of many people, a new "anthropological space" that is reshaping the way we think, know, and express ourselves. Naturally, this calls for a new understanding of faith so that it makes sense to people who live and work in the digital media environment. In developing the notion of cybertheology, Spadaro seeks to propose an intelligence of faith (intellectus fidei) in the era of the Internet. The book's chapters include reflections on man the decoder and the search engines of God, networked existence and the mystical body, hacker ethics and Christian vision, sacraments and "virtual presence," and the theological challenges of collective intelligence.

How can such a life be justified in view of the Gospel, which invites Christians to become a light to the world and to proclaim the good news to all peoples? This unique book, written by cloistered nuns themselves, provides answers to this and many other questions. Far from being an invention of the Middle Ages which was imposed on women by a male-dominated Church and society, enclosure was in

fact freely chosen by nuns themselves from the very beginning and only later became an object of canonical legislation. Dom Jean Prou (1911-1999) was fifth Abbot of the Abbey of Saint-Pierre de Solesmes and Abbot-President of the Solesmes Congregation from 1959 until his retirement in 1992. His high esteem for the vocation of enclosed nuns led to an invitation to oversee the international team of cloistered Benedictine nuns from France, Canada and England who cooperated to write this book.

Ciberteología - Antonio Spadaro 2014-05-05

Motores de búsqueda, teléfonos inteligentes, aplicaciones, redes sociales: la tecnología digital ha entrado en nuestra vida cotidiana no solo como una herramienta externa que simplifica la comunicación y la relación con el mundo, sino como un espacio antropológico nuevo que cambia nuestra forma de pensar y de conocer la realidad, así como las relaciones humanas. ¿Toca la revolución digital de alguna manera la fe? ¿Cómo debe pensar y enunciar el cristianismo este nuevo paisaje? La tarea de la Iglesia, como la de todas las distintas comunidades eclesiales, es acompañar al hombre en su camino, y la red forma parte integrante del recorrido humano de

un modo irreversible". Esta obra es parte de un ecosistema de reflexiones en el que conviven pontífices como Juan Pablo II y Benedicto XVI, teólogos como Tomás de Aquino y Teilhard de Chardin, poetas como Walt Whitman y T. S. Eliot, el jazz, Marshall McLuhan y la ética hacker.
