In Milena Agus' radiant Sardinia, Madame owns a piece of land by the sea which property developers are after. But Madame doesn't want to sell and therefore prevents her neighbours and other locals from cashing in. Even so, they can't help loving her for her generous and candid way of being. A fourteen year old girl tells the story through an imagination that shapes reality: her missing father appears in the slight movements of the air (Daddy's wings), and sharp scenes of hardcore sex seem to take place in Madame's house at night. It is a comic and truculent story, fairytale-like and true — as are all Milena Agus' works. Most of all, it is the story of love affairs that go somewhat awry but still manage to go on, which is the most important thing.

The Athenian Revolution - Josiah Ober 2020-09-01

Where did "democracy" come from, and what was its original form and meaning? Here Josiah Ober shows that this "power of the people" crystallized in a revolutionary uprising by the ordinary citizens of Athens in 508-507 B.C. He then examines the consequences of the development of direct democracy for upper-and lower-class citizens, for dissident Athenian intellectuals, and for those who were denied citizenship under the new regime (women, slaves, resident foreigners), as well as for the general development of Greek history. When the citizens suddenly took power into their own hands, they changed the cultural and social landscape of Greece, thereby helping to inaugurate the Classical Era. Democracy led to fundamental adjustments in the basic structures of Athenian society, altered the forms and direction of political thinking, and sparked a series of dramatic reorientations in international relations. It quickly made Athens into the most powerful Greek city-state, but it also fatally undermined the traditional Greek rules of warfare. It stimulated the development of the Western tradition of political theorizing and encouraged a new conception of justice that has striking parallels to contemporary theories of rights. But Athenians never embraced the notions of inherency and inalienability that have placed the concept of rights at the center of modern political thought. Thus the play of power that constituted life in democratic Athens is revealed as at once strangely familiar and desperately foreign, and the values sustaining the Athenian political community as simultaneously admirable and terrifying.

The difference of Catholic vs. Protestant can be vastly significant here. Some believe the bleeding and suffering is "not of God" in spite of evidence from photographs and medical examinations. They contend it is not God's will that we have to suffer because Christ did it all for us...there is no redemption in our suffering. The difference of Catholic and Protestant boils down to authority...the Bible or the Church. How we got the Bible was from the Church, not vice versa. Belief, by Catholics in the real presence of God in Holy Eucharist is also a major difference. The vast

majority of Protestants believe Christianity is based upon the Bible and everything we need to know is there. Holy Eucharist seems skipped over in Scripture or discarded by Protestants. Fortunately the view of the Catholic on abortion is frequently agreed upon by Protestants. Authority: Protestants believe the Bible is the only authority for Christians. Historical evidenced and the Bible itself contradict this. What is the Word of God (Bible) and where and how we got it needs explanation regarding "authority". Other issues covered are: spirit soul & body...the essence & dynamics of man, how to be filled with the Holy Spirit, how Christians can also have demons. Catholic symbols (statues), the uncorrupted body of saints, guidance from God, spiritual tools of God, fear vs. faith, devotion to Virgin Mary and eleven dimensions of God vs. our four. He defected from Athens to Sparta and from Sparta to Persia and then from Persia back to Athens, buffeted by scandal after scandal, most of them of his own making. A gifted demagogue and, according to his contemporaries, more handsome than the hero Achilles, Alcibiades is also a strikingly modern figure, whose seductive celebrity and dangerous ambition anticipated current crises of leadership.

Agata remains aloof, devoting herself to the cultivation of medicinal herbs, calmed by the steady rhythms of monastic life. She reads all the books James Garson sends her and follows the news of the various factions struggling to bring unity to Italy. Though she hasn't chosen to enter a convent, and is divided between her yearnings for purity and religiosity and her desire to be part of the world, something about the cloistered life reverberates within her. Agata is increasingly torn when she realizes that her feelings for James Garson, though he is only a distant presence in her life, have eclipsed those for Lepre.
